## Cancer Communication

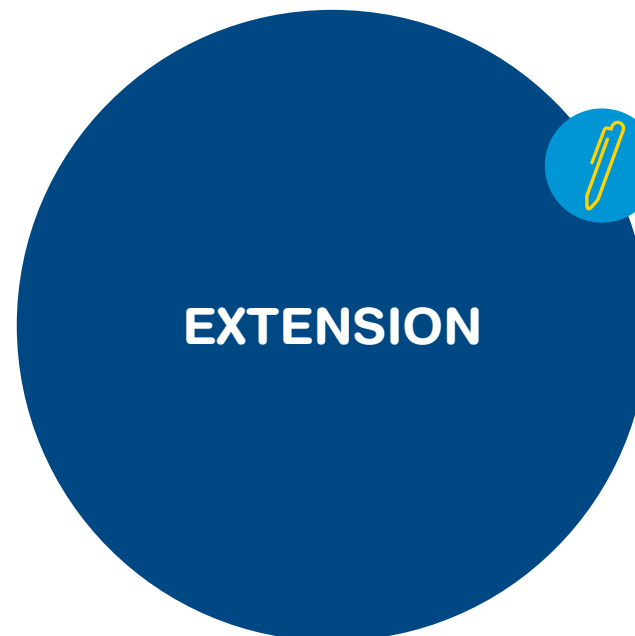
Cancer Council WA have partnered with Cancer Council Victoria (CCVic) to deliver the Victoria Cancer Clinicians Communication Program (VCCCP) in WA (CCCP).

Cancer health professionals acknowledge that insufficient training in communication and management skills is a major factor contributing to their stress, lack of job satisfaction and emotional burnout. Unfortunately, few have received adequate formal education in communication skills using methods likely to promote change, confidence and competence.

This course aims to meet the identified communication training needs of health care professionals.

The literature tells us that:

- Patients' psychological distress impedes their understanding, health behaviours and possibly survival
- Good communication can reduce patients' distress and lead to better adjustment and satisfaction
- Developing communication skills is in line with good clinical practice
- Effective communication can reduce clinicians' stress/ burnout and may lead to fewer complaints and litigation
- Clinicians express a need for training
- Communication skills don't necessarily get better with time

McLarty Palliative Care Scholarships are awarded to Nurses and Allied Health Professionals who seek to improve their knowledge, skills and clinical practice in palliative care through the completion of a Postgraduate Certificate, Postgraduate Diploma or Masters in palliative care.

## Eligibility criteria

### All applicants must be:

- A Registered Nurse or Allied Health Professional employed in WA
- An Australian citizen or have permanent residency status at the time of application
- Enrolling or enrolled in a course that leads to an accredited tertiary qualification with a palliative care focus
- Willing to submit a report following the scholarship and participate in scholarship evaluation
- Able to submit the completed application form and enclose copies of relevant documentation

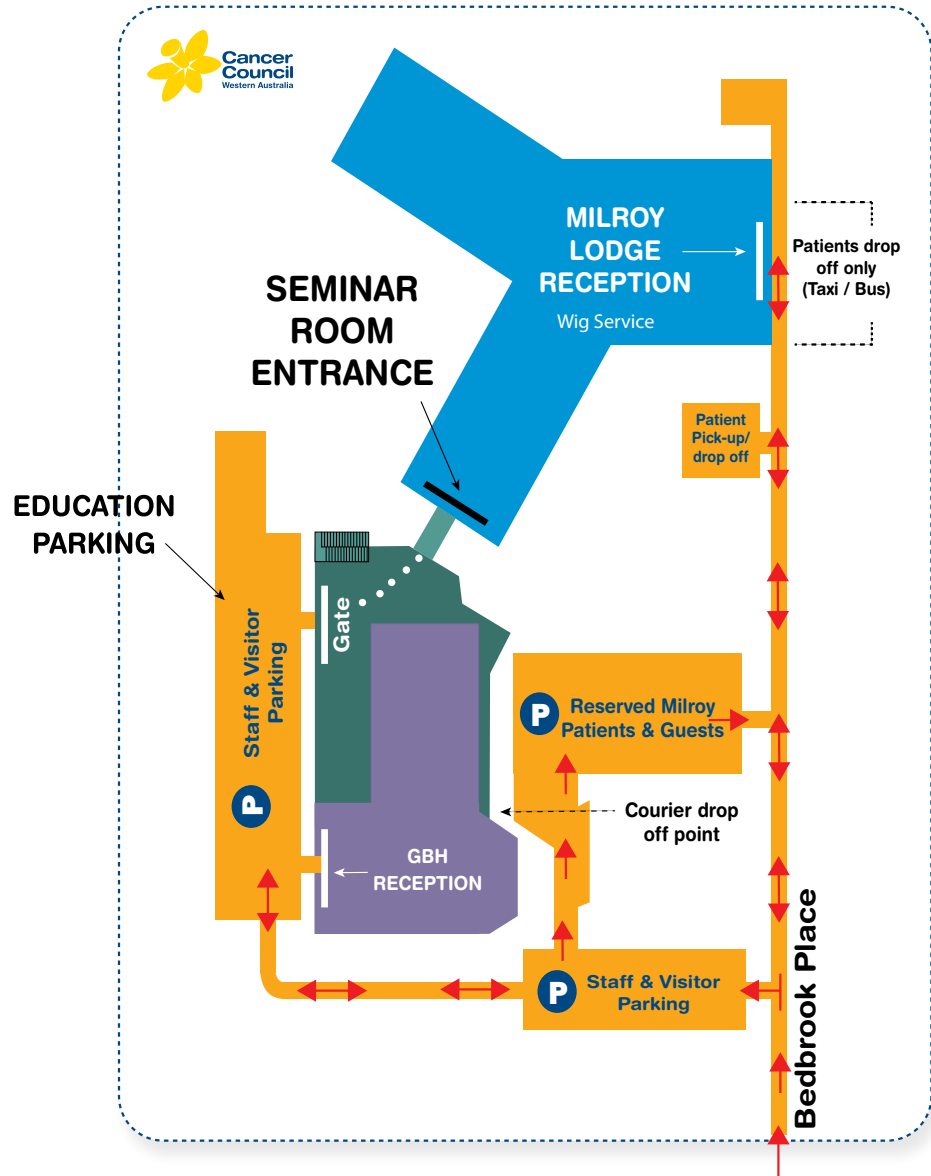
