Diabetes Updates for Health Professionals

Diabetes WA is offering a diabetes update for health professionals working within a hospital, medical practice, community health or aged care setting. The training will provide participants with an increased understanding of diabetes and the services available to their patients. Training is suitable for **Enrolled Nurses, Registered Nurses, GPs, Allied Health Professionals and Pharmacists.**

On completion of the study day participants will be able to:

- Gain understanding of the client's perspective of the pathophysiology of diabetes.
- Identify risk factors for diabetes, common signs and symptoms and diagnostic criteria.
- Identify the types of diabetes and implications for management.
- Review blood glucose monitoring and target ranges.
- Identify the implications of stress.
- Review medications and insulin regimens.
- Identify general nutrition and physical activity principles for diabetes management.
- Recognise the implications of short term complications of diabetes and management of hypoglycaemia.
- Identify the long term complications of diabetes and risk management.
- Discuss the role of the National Diabetes Services Scheme (NDSS).

Participants will also receive a pack of relevant resources.
